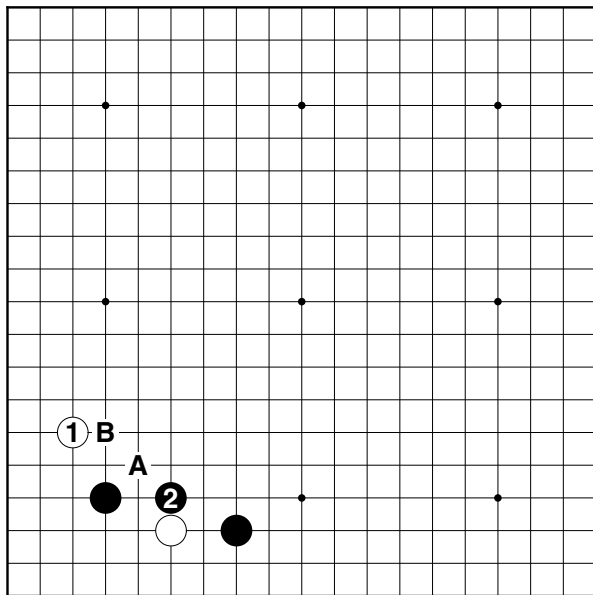


A6. JEONGSEOK [joseki]

WHITE'S DOUBLE APPROACH

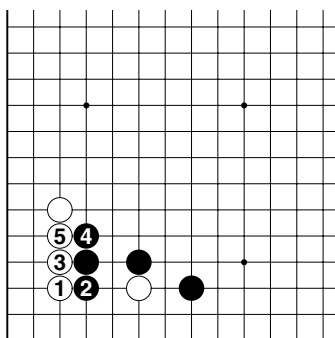
Scenario



Recently White's double approach at 1 has been seen quite often. Black 2 is right in this situation (A or B is also possible.). Study this pattern!

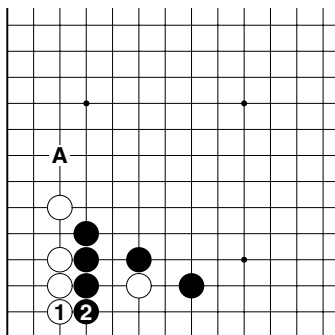


Jeongseok 1

White 1 is the first choice. Up to White 5 this is a jeongseok. White takes gote but Black's shape is a little thin.

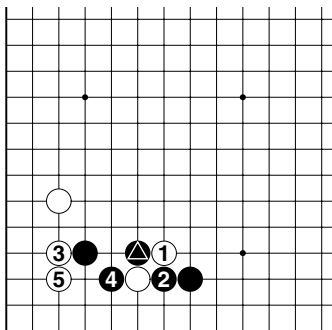
Jeongseok 2

White 1 is also possible. However, Black can aim at A later.

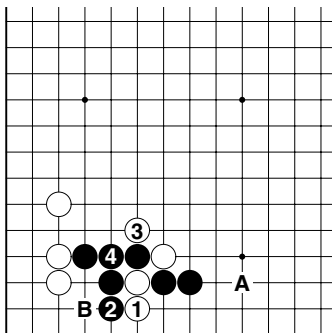


Modern Jeongseok

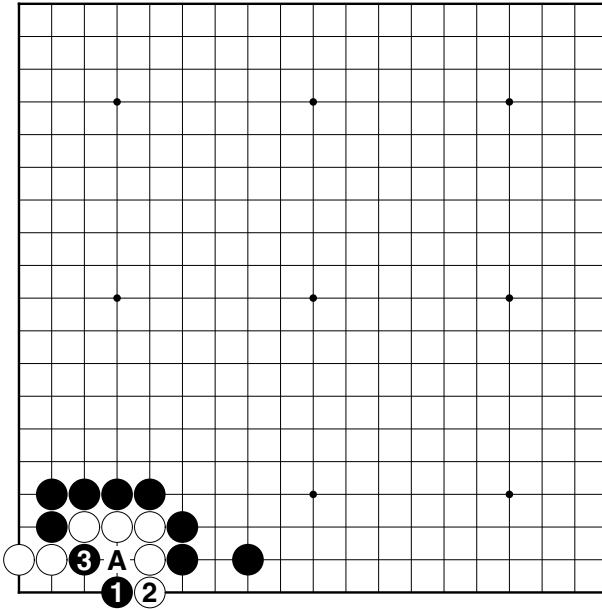
White 1 is a good sacrifice. Then White can make use of A and B.

SHORTAGE OF LIBERTIES

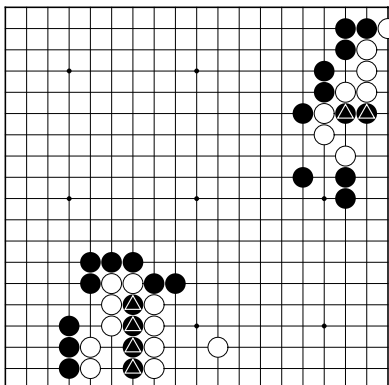
Scenario

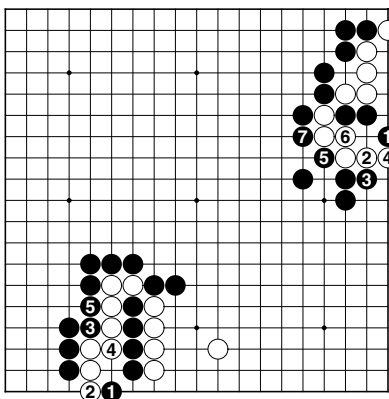
